## Outing Info

Outing fee is \$50 per person. This covers meals and contributes to boat rental and fuel. Boat costs will be subsidized from greenery profits. You will also need money for road meals on Friday and Sunday.

## Campsite

This trip is primitive camping with the campsite starting somewhere above the shoreline. All people and gear will be transported to the island by boat. To minimize equipment, one group menu will be offered.

## Location

Lake Mead Marina

Boulder City, NV 89005

Entrance fee is \$25. per vehicle,  
National Park passes are accepted.

Each driver will set departure time and location on Friday to arrive at the marina between 6pm and midnight. Scouts should expect to arrive back in Claremont at approximately 8pm, depending on traffic.
